- 1 Demonstrate conversation level skills in receptive and expressive American Sign Language. Completion of the ASL and Deaf Studies program (C114).
- 2 Other arrangements will be made for applicants unable to attend the information session.
- 3 **What You Need:**
 - Ontario Secondary School Diploma with six Grade 12 University (U) or University/College (M) courses, or equivalent with a combined average of 65% or above.
 - Grade 12 English (U) with a grade of 65 or higher. Subject to competition, applicants may be required to have grades/averages above the minimum.
 - Grade 11 University (U) or University/College (M) or Grade 12 Mathematics or Science. (One of the following: MCF3M, MCR3U, MCB4U, MCV4U, MGA4U, MDM4U, MHF4U, SBI3U, SCH3U, SPH3U, SNC3M, SBI4U, SCH4U, SPH4U, SES4U, SNC4M).
 - OR
 - Mature student status (21 years of age and out of formal school for two years): Grade 12 University (U) English and senior level Mathematics credits are still required.

There is no assessment testing for this program.
A TOEFL score of 580 (or equivalent), where applicable.
- 4 Other arrangements will be made for out-of-town applicants who live outside the Greater Toronto Area and who are unable to attend the information session.
- 5 If the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of seats available for this program, final student selection will be determined by the College based on departmental interview results and academic standing overall or within required courses. Subject to competition, applicants may be required to have grades/averages above the minimum.
- 6 Must have a Grade 12 English (4C) grade of 70 or higher.
- 7 Demonstrate proficiency in American Sign Language through a bilingual suitability competency interview.
- 8 Department English test.
