- 1 Other arrangements will be made for applicants unable to attend interview or information sessions.
- 2 80 hours of paid or volunteer work experience with children or adolescents aged 6 to 18 and one letter of reference.
- 3 Must have a B.A. or B.S. degree (3-year or 4-year – any major) or a 2-year or 3-year diploma in a human services program, such as Early Childhood Education, Child and Youth Worker, Social Service Worker, Human Services Counsellor, etc. to enter the program.
- 4 Must have a B.A. or B.S. degree (3-year or 4-year) with a major in Psychology.
- 5 English language proficiency required is Canadian Language Benchmark 7 in speaking, reading, writing and listening, IELTS Band 6 or TOEFL 78.
- 6 One course from this list: Biology, Grade 12 (U) or Grade 11 (C or U); Chemistry, Grade 12 (U or C) or Grade 11 (U); Physics, Grade 12 (U or C) or Grade 11 (U); Science, Grade 12 (U/C) or Grade 11 (U/C).
- 7 Students applying for C135 must have a diploma or degree in Social Sciences (related to social service work) and must successfully pass preparatory modules. Related experience may be required. A resumé is required.
- 8 Must have a Grade 12 English (4C) grade of 70, or (4U) grade of 65, or higher.
- 9 Questionnaire is available at georgebrown.ca on the R107 home page.
- 10 Students applying for C134 must have completed a course in Child Development or Developmental Psychology prior to admission. Overall GPA of 2.7 (B-) in previous program of study.
