Candidates will be accepted into the program based on the combination of relevant education and work experience. A TOEFL score of 580 (or equivalent), where applicable (see page 254).

8 Physics courses are recommended. Post-secondary (college or university) courses which are equivalent to the secondary school requirements stated will be accepted.

9 Applicants with international transcripts where TOEFL is not supplied must test at GBC College level English to be accepted.
