1 English language proficiency required is Canadian Language Benchmark 8 or equivalent or successful completion of the George Brown College ESL Level 8.

2 **What You Need:**

- College diploma or university degree
- Current resumé
- English language proficiency required is Canadian Language Benchmark 7 in speaking, reading, listening and writing.

3 **What You Need:**

- English language proficiency assessment at Canadian Language Benchmark 7 in reading and writing, and Benchmark 8 in speaking and listening, or higher
- One year of full-time teaching experience at a secondary or post-secondary level or similar experience
- Graduate-level degree (masters or doctorate) or equivalent credential in apprenticeship/skill required to teach in a college setting.

4 **What You Need:**

- Graduate-level degree (masters or doctorate) from outside Canada. Preference may be given to applicants with a science and technology background or a professional background (e.g., engineering). Applicants who have some background in running their own business, in research, or who have their own commercialization project will be preferred.
- English language proficiency required is Canadian Language Benchmark 8 in speaking, reading and writing and Benchmark 9 in listening. (Applicants who are assessed at Benchmark 7 in speaking, reading and writing and Benchmark 8 in listening will be provided with a specialized two-month English as a Second Language program that starts before the regular program.)
- Interview to identify knowledge/skills gaps and determine best field placement/project assignment.

5 Applicants must be 18 or older at the start of classes.

6 Prospective students must be landed immigrants who have an international degree or diploma in health sciences or a related field and who preferably have one to two years of employment experience in a health science field.

All applicants must undergo English testing. Applicants must be assessed at Canadian Language Benchmark 7 in speaking, reading and writing and Benchmark 8 in listening for direct entry in January 2010. Applicants who are assessed at Benchmark 6 in speaking, reading and writing and Benchmark 7 in listening will be provided with a two-month pre-program intensive ESL course prior to program start, at no extra cost.
