The incumbent will have highly effective interpersonal skills, communication, creative problem-solving, strategic planning, and partnership development competencies. A graduate degree from a recognized post-secondary institution in the areas of Counselling Psychology, Clinical Psychology, or Social Work is required; candidates must also be registered to practice psychotherapy in the province of Ontario (e.g., registered social worker, registered psychologist, or psychotherapist).
