## YouTube Video:

Uploader. (year, Month day). *Title of video* [Video]. YouTube. URL

The uploader of a Youtube video is not necessarily the author or the person/group that created video. If the uploader is the author, but their channel name is different, you should do it as follows:

Stevens, M. [Vsauce]. (2014, May 19). *Why don't we all have cancer?* [Video].
