

International Credential Evaluations



Do you have previous education from outside of Canada?

Your international credentials can potentially be used to help you gain admission or earn transfer credits to most programs at the college. High school and post-secondary credentials earned in a different country can be evaluated by a recognized assessor.



Before having your credentials evaluated

Credential evaluations are used for a variety of purposes. Therefore, to ensure you are getting what you need for your application, it is important to review the college website for the specific admission requirements for the program you are applying to.

Factors to consider for entering George Brown College

Undergraduate:
Certificate, Diploma, Advanced Diploma, Degree


Previous level of education required:
High school diploma equivalency


Subject requirements: Programs may require specific high school subjects like Math, Biology, or Chemistry

Postgraduate:
Graduate Certificate

Previous level of education required:
University or college diploma equivalency

Subject requirements: Programs may require credentials from specific fields like psychology, business, or computer science

Transferring credits
If you've completed university or college level courses from outside of Canada, you may be able to transfer credits towards your program at George Brown. A comprehensive course evaluation is required for each course you want considered for transfer credit. Scan the QR code for more about transferring credits.

English proficiency
If your previous education was not delivered in English, you will need to demonstrate your proficiency through an approved English test or pathway program. Scan the QR code to review options to meet English proficiency requirements.
