

Program Roadmap: Is this program right for you?

About You

- You like to work with people.
- You're analytical and a creative problem solver.
- You remain calm, cool and collected under stress, as you may have to provide support to clients with complex emotional or aggressive tendencies.
- You want to work within a scientific approach to human behaviour. This includes developing your math and science skills.



Are you ready?

- To attend up to 20 hours of class per week, and to do 1 hour of prep for every hour of class. For those with a part-time job, we recommend working no more than 10 hours per week.
- To synthesize large amounts of complex information in a short time – so English comprehension is extremely important.
- To do shiftwork including some holidays, weekends and evenings.
- To be able to work as part of a diverse team, sometimes including the guardian or parent, but also one-on-one with clients.

Did you know?

- Behavioural analysis is the science of human behaviour change. We train you to identify and assess root causes of problematic behaviours in a wide range of clients from children to seniors.
- After graduating, you may complete additional certification to become RBT-certified (Registered Behaviour Technician)*. You may also be eligible to move into our Honours Bachelors of Behavioural Analysis program (S302) and apply to become a Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA)*.

- We offer two diploma completion streams: C146 (2 years of full-time study) or C156 (fast-track; 3 consecutive semesters of intensive study for candidates with a previous post-secondary degree in a related field).
- Two field placements are required in both streams. They offer you exposure to a wide variety of settings including: mental health at [Centre for Addiction and Mental Health](#)¹² (CAMH); brain injury at [University Health Network](#)¹³(UHN); forensics; gerontology.
